INTRODUCTION

The Town of Gore Bay, located on the North Channel of Lake Huron, is nestled between two splendid, tree covered bluffs. Incorporated in 1890, Gore Bay is one of the larger communities on Manitoulin with a permanent population of just over 900. Gore Bay is the judicial centre of Manitoulin, and one of the island's commercial and professional centres.

The town features one of the largest marinas on Manitoulin Island. During the summer months the population and activity of the town flourishes as boaters and tourists from around Ontario and the Great Lakes regions flock to the area. The area is popular with cottagers and vacationers during the summer months. Gore Bay is an attractive town where there is lots to see and do

This strategic plan captures Council's key priorities, but it does not include the multitude of responsibilities to it citizens or businesses. The plan focuses on the direction Council wants to make based on all the community input received during the planning process.


Strategic Plan

The Strategic Planning Process involves the following stages:




2. MAYOR'S REPORT



A Strategic Plan should identify a preferred outlook for a community. Ask the questions what do you want to achieve? What kind of community do you want to live in?


Performing a visioning exercise at the beginning of the strategic process helps act as guide for the rest by building a foundation for the remaining areas to follow.

5. GOALS & OBJECTIVES DEVELOPMENT

RECREATION & CULTURE



"The Town of Gore Bay will continue to investigate new cultural and recreational opportunities as well as maintain existing programs."

6. MANAGEMENT

Implementation will involve aligning resources, activities and opportunities with the vision developed through the strategic planning process. Key performance metrics will be used to evaluate if Council decisions are in alignment with the strategic plan.

Questions that will be asked include:

- Did we achieve what we set out to do?
- Did actions taken have a desired outcome?
- Are we any closer to achieving our goals?

Metrics used will be tangible and measurable but can and will be in the form of progress reports. Outside influences contribute to successes or failures in achieving goals. Metrics will also only include an evaluation of components that the Town has exclusive accountability for.

Gore Bay Council will continue to seek input from its constituent body.

The strategic plan is an evergreen document, meaning that it will be adapted as evaluations are made.

Yearly evaluations of the 2022-2027 Strategic Plan will be communicated to the public by a report.

A Mayor's Report will be provided to the Public yearly to provide an update on all Town projects.
